We would like to invite you to our end of year awards ceremonies at Henrietta Junior High. The 6th and 7th grade award ceremony will be held on May 24th at 12:00 noon in the junior high gym. The 8th grade promotion ceremony will be held at 6:00 pm in the Henrietta High School new gymnasium. 8th grade students will need to arrive by 5:00 pm for class and individual pictures that will be taken in the old gym at the high school. We have attached an explanation of awards that will be given and students that will be recognized. Students that will be receiving an award will have a picture taken on Monday morning for the yearbook.

The following awards and students will be recognized at the award ceremony:

Recognize students in the following groups: Cheerleaders, Student Council, and National Junior Honor Society.

UIL Literary Team Members (Recognize students who participated in the UIL Academic meet in December.)

Read for Life Top Students (Recognize top readers in each grade.)

Bluebonnet Reading Award (6th grade students earned the Bluebonnet Reading award by reading 5 books on the current Bluebonnet book list.)

Lone Star Reading Award (7th grade and 8th grade students earned the Lone Star Reading award by reading eight books on the current Lone Star book list.)

Perfect Attendance (Students who had no absences and no tardies all school year.)

Daily Attendance (Students who were present during the accountability period every day of the school year.)

Honor Students (These students have maintained a combine average of 90 or better in all academic courses all year, and have not received lower than an S in conduct.)

Who's Who Awards (This award is given to the outstanding students in each subject.)

Meritorious Conduct Awards (To qualify for this award a student must have no discipline referrals, no more than 2 tardies per semester, no unexcused absences, no citizenship grade below an S, and must be enrolled for the full year.)

Outstanding Citizen Awards (2 boys and 2 girls per grade are nominated for this award by teachers for exemplary conduct and behavior toward teachers and classmates.)

President's Award for Outstanding Academic Achievement (Teachers nominate 2 students per grade who showed outstanding growth, achievement, and commitment in a subject.)

President's Award for Outstanding Academic Excellence (To be eligible for this award, students must have made all A's on their report card each six weeks and received no conduct grade lower than an S.)
